Fake news and online disinformation in Germany (60 min)

The spread of news that intentionally mislead readers has become an increasing problem for the functioning of our democracies, affecting people's understanding of reality. Misinformation and disinformation have the power to promote negative narratives about certain groups and civil society in general and represent a danger to European democratic values. A 2018 Eurobarometer poll asked Europeans to give their thoughts on the topic "Fake news and online disinformation" covering the following topics:

- Level of trust in new sources
- People's perceived exposure to fake news and the ability to recognize it
- Impact of fake news and responsibility for addressing the problem
