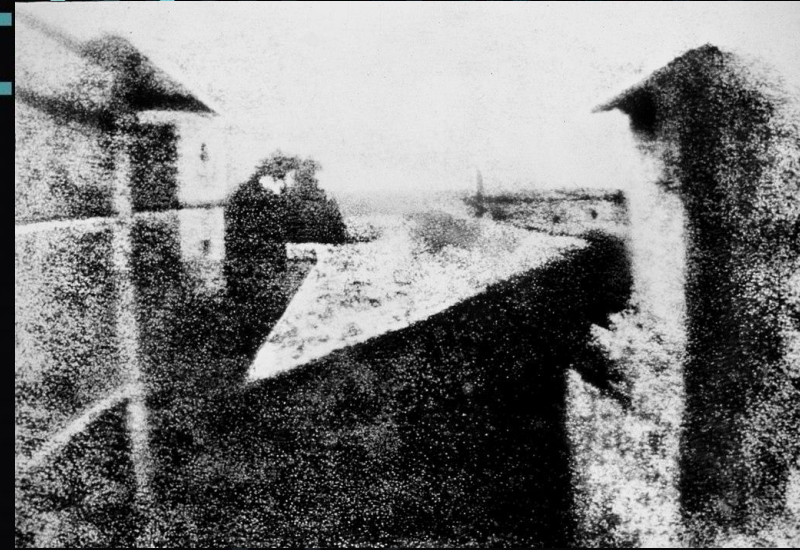

FIRST PHOTO EVER

The first photography dates from 1826 and is entitled "View from the window at La Gras" and was taken by Joseph-Nicéphore Niépce. This image took more than eight hours of exposure and the quality of the photograph was not very good, so the author decided to investigate further methods of making photographs.

COLOUR PHOTOGRAPHY

The origins of colour photography date back to 1855. At first it was not possible to eliminate the problem of colour fading, and the work on extending the colour range of optical filters continued unabated until 1907, when autochrome was introduced.

BASIC PRINCIPLES OF GOOD PHOTOGRAPHY

When creating your own photographs, whether for personal, artistic or professional purposes, it's worth familiarising yourself with the basic principles of good photography.

Proper exposure & lightning

Exposure is nothing more than the amount of light falling on the sensor that is needed to take a properly exposed photo. In photography, there is the concept of the exposure triangle. The exposure triangle consists of

aperture

exposure time

ISO

The proper operation of these three parameters is essential when it comes to good quality photography.



Using natural frames

Using natural frames in the surroundings gives the photo spaciousness. In this way, several plans are obtained and, depending on which plan is in focus, you can decide where the viewers should focus their attention.

The rule of thirds

This is the basic division governing the principles of composition in photography. It states that the most important points of a photo should be placed in its thirds. This way, the photos will have the right balance and maintain order.



Lines

When looking at photographs, the human eye naturally follows lines. Lines also create a kind of depth-of-field effect and therefore give a three-dimensional impression. Lines can be created for example by buildings, trees, rivers, etc.



Straight Horizons

A straight horizon in a photograph is essential. The human mind likes order and harmony, so focus on making sure the horizon in your photo looks natural - horizontally. If necessary, you can level the photo during the editing stage.





BASIC CAMERA FEATURES

Now that you know the basics of photography, it's time to get better acquainted with the equipment and its features that make good photography possible

ISO

ISO sensitivity is the parameter responsible for a photograph's correct exposure. The higher the ISO value, the more light sensitive the camera becomes. At low ISO sensitivities, more light is required for proper exposure; at higher ISO sensitivities, much less light is required.



White balance

This parameter is responsible for the realistic representation of colours in a photo. In order to avoid colour discrepancies or discolouration, we can use this setting to "inform" the camera about the colour of light in the photographed frame.



Focus settings

Setting the focus manually allows you to select the specific object you want in focus. Autofocus, on the other hand, allows you to lock the focus on a specific, stationary object - this enables you to change the composition and keep the focus on the selected point.



Selecting the right parameters

Cameras also give you the option to choose how many pixels you want the recorded image to consist of and what proportion you want it to have. Depending on the device you are using, you have different options to choose from. When it comes to proportions, we can mainly choose between square, 4:3 and 16:9

Among them there are free ones - with basic editing and retouching functions, and paid ones (usually up to 15 euros for applications, while for paid programs they are a bit more expensive) that give us professional functions, solutions and effects/filters. 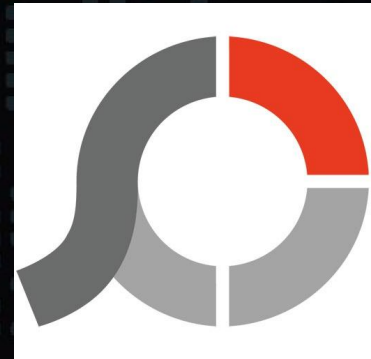

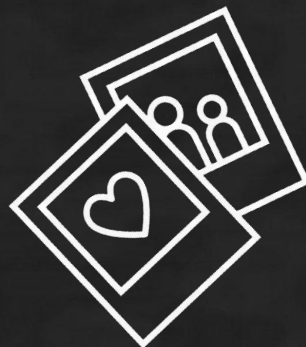

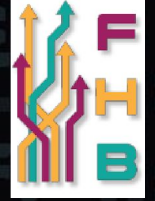
